Second, God could be using these memories for a purpose. For example, the apostle Paul remembered when he was a blasphemer and a persecutor of the church (see 1 Timothy 1:12-14). He knew God wanted to use those memories in his ministry to others.

If God has allowed you to go through some painful experiences, and if you have forgiven the person but still have the memories, God wants to use that event for your growth and His glory.

Pumpkin Date Bread

3½ cups flour
3 cups sugar
¾ teaspoon salt
2 teaspoons soda

Mix until smooth. Stir in walnuts and dates. Pour batter into 3 well-greased loaf pans.

Bake for 50 minutes or until bread tests done.

Slow Cooker Caramel Apple Crumble

Ingredients

For the apples:

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 5 large apples, peeled and cut into chunks
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

For the topping:

- 2/3 cup oats
- 2/3 cup loosely packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3-4 tablespoons softened butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions

1. In a mixing bowl, combine brown sugar, granulated sugar, apples, salt, and cinnamon. Spread onto bottom of slow cooker.
 2. Mix your crumble topping ingredients until it comes together. Sprinkle it over top of the apples. Cook on low for 4 hours, or high for 2 hours.
 3. Turn off heat and let sit, covered, for one hour to let the caramel thicken

- mini chocolate chips

Instructions

1. Spread peanut butter on top of the apple slice.
2. Next sprinkle with chocolate chips.
3. Continue until all slices are done.
4. *Serve and enjoy!*

MAKING A LEAF BOWL

A leaf bowl is exactly what it sounds like: A bowl made out of leaves! In just a few minutes and with minimal supplies you can whip up your own bowl and add some instant charm to your fall table. This is also a fun project to do with kids, and they can admire their project when it is used as a centerpiece on the dinner table!

To make a leaf bowl, here is what you will need:

- Several dozen palm-sized leaves. They should still be pliable and not dry. If you wish you may use artificial fall leaves. My Dollar Tree sells packages of them for \$1.00.
- Mod Podge. This is available at all crafts stores and even Walmart for around \$3.00.
- Paintbrush
- Plastic Wrap
- Cooking Spray
- Paint Brush
- Medium sized bowl

Once you have your supplies organized, put the bowl together! You must prep the bowl you are using as your mold.

-Do this by spraying the outside of the bowl with cooking spray, then covering it with plastic wrap. This protects the bowl and prevents the leaves from adhering to it.

-Turn the prepped bowl upside down. Begin placing the leaves on to the bowl and “painting” them with Mod Podge. Use A LOT and paint it on thick to make sure it fully saturates the leaves.

-Continue “painting” on the leaves until you have the designs you want. Make sure there are no gaps in the leaves and that the entire bowl is covered.

-Put another coat of Mod Podge over all the leaves that cover the bowl. Allow it to dry overnight.

-The next day, gently separate the leaves from the plastic wrap.

The bowl mold should fall off nicely and leave you with a sturdy leaf bowl. Place it on your fall table and fill it with small items such as candy, or place it under a glass bowl and use it as a fun serving piece.

Either way it is a quick and easy craft that you can quickly put together with items you already have! And it’s a fun conversation piece that will leave your guests wondering how you did it!

Caramel Apple Pork Chops

PREP TIME 5 MINUTES; COOK TIME 25 MINUTES; SERVES 4

Ingredients

- 6-8 boneless pork chops (1/2 inch to 3/4 inch thick)
- 1 tablespoon oil
- 2 apples, peeled, cored, and sliced (A firm apple like a Granny Smith is best)
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350°. Heat the oil in a large skillet, over medium high heat and then brown the pork chops (about 1 minute on each side).

Remove the browned chops from the skillet and set them aside. In the same skillet, over medium heat, melt butter and add the brown sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg. Stir until the sauce is completely combined and then add the apples.

Cook the apples in the caramel sauce for about 3 minutes, stirring occasionally. Then add the pork chops back to the skillet and sprinkle with the chopped pecans.

Bake for 25 minutes or until pork chops are cooked through. The apples will be tender and the sauce will be bubbly. Spoon the apples and sauce over the pork chops when serving.

Seconds after I stopped I got a glimpse in my peripheral vision to my right of someone waving their hands at me. It was my boss! He was trying to tell me I had a flat tire. I'd not felt the car driving any differently and was totally unaware that my back tire was almost completely flat.

My boss, Esteban lives in Massillon and was also on his way to work when he saw me. The traffic in that area especially in the morning rush is really bad. As he was in the lane to my right, he held the traffic for me so I could make a right turn in front of his car from my lane and get off the street. As it happens the business on that corner and the lot I pulled into was Hi-Way Tire – a full service tire store. They weren't open at that early hour but I only had to wait about a half an hour for the store to open. Esteban went on to work and left me to wait on my own. When the tire store did open, they took me right in and changed my tire. I was out the door and on my way in a very short time.

During that whole event I was totally relaxed, non-stressed and somewhat amazed at what some people might call coincident after coincident occurring. I tend to look at things a little differently and simply call it blessed. First, if my boss hadn't happened along at just that time, I'm sure I'd been much farther along in my journey to work when I discovered I had a tire problem. It could have been possibly in the fast moving traffic of Route 21 or maybe even later along a long stretch of Route 62 somewhere between small towns with no help readily available. No matter where it would have happened after that, it would at least have been very inconvenient and at the other end of

the spectrum been even dangerous. Next, what are the odds of my boss coming along at just the exact moment he did to help me. I had not seen him before or after when coming through Massillon in the morning. We usually arrive at work on a little different schedule so it never happened before. By Esteban being there, he not only let me know about my tire but helped me to safely get out of traffic and into the parking lot at the tire store. When the tire store opened they moved my car inside, checked the bad tire, found an almost new tire that was in my price range, and replaced it. They also went a step further and did a pressure check of all three other tires to be sure they were okay, too. Everything just fell into place throughout the event right down to not having to call work to tell them I would be late that morning. My boss already knew where I was and why.

There are events similar to this happening all the time in people's lives. Some notice but some fail to put together the pieces to spotlight the obvious hand of God at work in our lives. It seems that more people would like to chalk things up as coincident or accident or luck, than give God His due. He never said trouble wouldn't find us but he did promise to be there and support us when bad things did happen.

Most of the time I hear people lamenting the bad thing while not giving voice to the good that happened either to help with the bad thing or as a result of the bad thing. They look at each event as being totally unrelated one to the other – spotlighting the bad thing while ignoring the good, just taking it for granted.

Each of us needs to take a step back sometimes and take a long look at where we are and how he got to this place. If we are honest we will be able to see a clear picture of the path that has led us to where we are, and why as well. God did not put us here with no idea of what to do with us or to just let us run amuck. He has a plan for us and it's all good. It's up to us to recognize His influence, follow His instructions, and just enjoy the journey.

And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.
