Songs We Love

Since Easter is coming up I thought I would write about a song that is often sung at Easter. It was written by a Scottish woman in the mid 1800's, Elizabeth C. Clephane, 1830-1869. She was a sickly woman, growing up with various illnesses, that left her bedridden quite a lot. But her cheery smile and kind heart made her popular with the townspeople. Rather than calling her by Elizabeth they called her Sunshine.

There is no neutral ground when we face the cross: Either we accept the work of atonement or we reject it. We become a new person or we stay in our sinful and self-centered life. Two things stood out as she composed this hymn: "The wonders of His glorious love and my own worthlessness."

She was an ardent Bible student and that comes across in the song Beneath The Cross Of Jesus. She talks about "mighty Rock" in Isaiah 32:2; "weary land" in Psalm 63:1; "home within the wilderness "in Jeremiah 9:2; "rest upon the way" in Isaiah 28:12; "noontide heat" in Isaiah 4:6 and "burden of the day" in Matthew 11:30. Here is her song.

Beneath the cross of Jesus, I fain would take my stand, the shadow of a mighty rock within a weary land; a home within the wilderness, a rest upon the way from the burning of the noon day heat and the burden of the day.

Upon that cross of Jesus mine eyes at times can see the very dying form of One who suffered there for me; and from my smitten heart with tears two wonders I confess--the wonders of His glorious love and my own worthlessness.

I take, O cross thy shadow for my abiding place--I ask no other sunshine than the sunshine of His face; content to let the world go by, to know no gain or loss, my sinful self, my only shame, my glory all the cross.

Chicken Divan Pot Pie by Kraft

Prep Time:5 min. Total Time:45 min. Servings:8 1 cup servings

3 cups chopped cooked chicken 3 cups frozen broccoli florets 1/2 lb. (8 oz.) VELVEETA, cut into 1/2-inch cubes 1 jar (12 oz.) HEINZ HomeStyle Classic Chicken Gravy 1 ready-to-use refrigerated pie crust (1/2 of 14.1-oz. pkg.)

Creamy Bacon Vegetable Soup from Kraft

Makes 6 one cup servings.

6 slices OSCAR MAYER Bacon, cut into 1-inch pieces

2 carrots, chopped

2 stalks celery, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced

1 onion, chopped
2 Tbsp. flour

2 cans (15.5 oz. each) butter beans, rinsed

2 cans (14.5 oz. each) fat-free reduced-sodium chicken broth

4 oz. (1/2 of 8-oz. pkg.) PHILADELPHIA Cream Cheese, cubed

Cook and stir bacon in large saucepan on medium heat until crisp. Remove bacon from pan with slotted spoon; drain on paper towels. Add carrots, celery and onions to bacon drippings in pan; cook 8 to 10 min. or until crisp-tender, stirring occasionally. Add garlic and flour; cook 2 min., stirring frequently.

Stir in beans and broth; bring just to boil. Simmer on medium-low heat 25 min. or until vegetables are tender, stirring in cream cheese for the last 5 min. Remove from heat. Stir in bacon.

What's in a Name?

From the beginning of human kind, starting with Adam and Eve, every person has been given a name. This name was unique to them.
